Shugen Roshi is the head of the Mountains and Rivers Order, abbot and resident teacher of Zen Mountain Monastery, and abbot of the Zen Center of NYC. Shugen Roshi has been in full-time residential training since 1986; he received dharma transmission from Daido Roshi in 1997. His teachings have appeared in various Buddhist journals and in *The Best Buddhist Writing 2009*. His first book, a collection of memorial poems titled *O, Beautiful End*, was published in 2012.

Roshi's talk on the Metta Sutta and the discussion on Karma are based on the fundamental teachings of the historical Buddha. We are fortunate to have a teacher with a depth and breadth of decades-long monastic training and practice come here to make these teachings available to us.
